This book traces the history of the " Evangelicals " who, breaking away from the early Wesleyans and Methodists, remained within the Church of England. The author paints the dead condition of religious life in the eighteenth century, describes the rise of the Holy Club at Oxford and the work of Whitefield and the two Wesleys, showing how the Evangelical Revival was at first entirely a Church of England Movement. He traces the development of the rift which took place in the reforming party, some drifting into dissent, the others, the " Evangelicals," remaining loyal to the Church. In dealing with later history, he discusses the Oxford Movement and the controversies which surrounded it, and he calls special attention to the practical contribution of the Evangelicals in the slums and in Foreign Missions.
